# 13/05 4. Annual Reports

## **Secretary – Keith Smith**

During this year Gloucester County ASA has provided the County Swimming Championships, County Open Water Swimming Championships and Masters Swimming events to its members. The County has also sent representative swimming teams to the 3-Counties Gala in Worcester and the ASA Inter County Championships at Sheffield. The County was not able to provide any more development opportunities again through lack of volunteer effort to spend the time to organise any extra activity.

We have throughout the year been active in training officials and team managers and thanks go out to Marion Britton and Neil Harper. GCASA has also awarded  $\pm 1800+$  in bursaries for members to undertake UKCC Teacher and Coach training.

The County Association has operated this year without a full Secretary or President, which has been difficult. Finding time for general admin has been very hard but we have found the time to agree and then employ a part-time paid administrator who took up post in early May 13. This I hope will enable the County Association to run much more effectively and develop the range of activities it can provide and support.

Times are now changing significantly with the ASA Centre organisation. There is no longer a Regional Director or a responsibility for the South West Region (SWR) ASA to deliver ASA Centre business targets. The SWR Chair no longer has line management responsibility for ASA Centre staff.

The SWR is now more autonomous and is developing a new strategy which will rely on strong County Associations to deliver in the future. The County ASA now has a change to significantly influence and support the Region's activity to provide a better overall environment for our Clubs.

We have made some progress in fostering the debate on improving the efficiency of County Management but as yet no material decisions have been made and we are still operating with "an "executive" governance arrangement. I would still encourage the County to change to a smaller annually elected "Management Board" with the power to manage in year, and an associated "Members Forum" to ensure the membership is made aware of the Management Board's progress.

# Swimming – Will Nicholson

I would like to begin by thanking everyone who helped at the County Championships for 2013 as without all of the various helpers (Technical and Non-Technical) the blocks would not be as successful as they are. However it was disappointing that at the distance events some took the wrong attitude when it came to helping out and in some of the latter sessions there were qualified officials filling some of the roles!

Entries this year increased by  $\pounds756$  (189 entries) but unfortunately Team entries were down by  $\pounds820$  (82 teams), 30 of these entries were from 3 clubs not taking part and several were from the third teams no longer being able to compete. The other contributing factor is that the last weekend clashed with the beginning of the Easter Holidays.

Qualifying time failures were up by 53 (289) compared to 236 failures in 2012. This figure is also up by 14 compared to (275) failures in 2010. Last year I reported that income was up and DQMs were down, I would say that the Income was stable but DQMs have gone the wrong way! Hopefully in 2014 we will see better figures.

This year there were 40 boys and 17 girls Age Group Best Times, 5 boys and 5 girls Competition Best Times and 2 Male and 4 Female County Records. One of these records was long-standing going back to 1987. In short another very good year, even better than 2012.

# **Officials – Neil Harper**

Currently, the County is blessed with a dedicated group of volunteers who are licensed officials. Without them, the County would not be able to hold its Blocks each year. For the past couple of years, numbers joining the list have been greater than those who have left. To all those on the list I give my heartfelt thanks – you make a difficult job a lot easier.

In saying that though, we should not be complacent! There is one area especially where we are woefully short of numbers – and that is in the ranks of our referees. We currently have six in the County. To run a successful session at the Blocks I need four. It doesn't take a lot of working out to see the stress that can be placed on that group of people, so all you J2S's out there, we need you to take the plunge and become refs, otherwise the County could be in difficulty over the next couple of years!

With relation to licensed officials, we are now getting to the stage where many of you will be coming to the end of your first licensing period. You should have a reminder sent to you by the ASA, prior to your current one expiring. This means you will have had to have completed to mandatory CPD elements, i.e. FINA up – date and contemporary issues. If you have not, please contact me and we can make arrangements to address that issue.

Finally, the County should be very proud of the fact that we have one of the youngest (if not the youngest) officials in the Country and hopefully we will encourage more youngsters into continuing in the sport within this arena.

# Synchro – Ian Stuart

After the Olympic year we have seen an increased interest in synchro, with many youngsters making inquiries and taking it up. Hopefully they will stay with their clubs and progress within the recreational and competitive streams.

The Walsall Trophy, a SWR competition with seven clubs taking part, will take place at Cheltenham on 18th May 2013 with Cheltenham entering an U12 duet and team and an U19 duet and team.

Other future competitions are the Novice Figures competition, which gives many swimmers their first competition experience, on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2013 at Cheltenham and the Multi-Regional recreational strand competition on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2013 at Plymouth. The competitive strand competition will be held at GL1 on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2013.

The final competition of the year will be the National Age Groups on 29<sup>th</sup> November - 1<sup>st</sup> December 2013 at GL1 in Gloucester when swimmers from Bristol Central and Cheltenham compete in the figures, solos, duets and team events in all the age groups.

The British Championships were held at Sheffield on 13<sup>th</sup>/14th April 2013, with Bristol Central entering competitors in a number of events and had a very successful competition. The full results are at

The Multi-Regional competition was held at the Plymouth Life Centre on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2012, and the National Age Group competition was held at GL1 on December 1<sup>st</sup> / 2<sup>nd</sup> 2012, the competitive results being at

The ASASWR Synchro Standing Committee met on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2012 and on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2013 at the ASA Regional Office, and will meet again on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2013.

Numerous skill assessment days have been arranged around the country which Gloucestershire swimmers attended, and development days have been held locally and regionally for swimmers, coaches and officials.

More assessment and development days will be held during the year, using Honiton Leisure Centre and Marlborough School as venues.

I would like to thank Janice Waters, Mary Hooper and Viv Ebbs for organising and publicising many of these days and their involvement in the organisation of competitions, and to thank all the coaches, officials and volunteers for their time and dedication.

# **Masters - Herbie Adams**

Masters' Swimming in the County revolves mainly around 2 activities, the annual Masters' Championships, in September, and the National Annual Inter County Masters' Competition, in November. In both the County continues to make steady, if slow, progress.

The Championships in 2013 were run, as usual, in connection with Somerset ASA at Horfield LC. Entries, and thus receipts, showed an encouraging upturn. However, we still fail to attract swimmers in the 18 - 24 age group. Competitors in this group are not technically master swimmers but all masters' events run this section for two major reasons: to cater for swimmers who have outgrown age-group swimming and its demands, and to introduce younger adult swimmers to the masters' side of the Sport.

In the Inter county, we gained our best ever result, ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the Country with, undoubtedly, the best team we have ever put out. Much of the team's success may be attributed to its strength in depth and its resulting performances in the team races.

Masters' swimming is greatly indebted to the support it receives from a small, but dedicated, bunch of Technical Officials who grace our meets with their expertise. We cannot thank them enough but are cheered by the fact that they seem to enjoy being with us for the day. On this note, we would be overjoyed to swell their ranks.

We are equally indebted to the County administration and are aware that, as a minority branch of the Sport, we require support. Capitalism promotes economies of scale and, thus, acts against small scale operations; and modern swimming seems to be embracing hard-line capitalist theory. We do have a deficit, but we do have a deficit-reduction plan and one that worked rather better in the past year than similar, more publicised, undertakings. It continues in 2013/14.

# **Open Water Report – Alan Giles**

Open Water training and familiarisation sessions were held at Henleaze Lake in preparation for the Open Water County Championships on Sunday 8 July 2012.

The ASA South West Open water championships were held at Bradley Stoke Water Park, Bristol on Sunday 1 July 2012 – this venue was used as Weymouth was not available due to London 2012 Olympic sailing events being held at Weymouth.

I attended the ASA South West Open Water committee on behalf of GCASA – this committee meets twice a year in March and September, with representatives from the region's Counties.
