Secretary – Keith Smith

During this year Gloucester County ASA has provided the County Swimming
Championships, County Open Water Swimming Championships and Masters Swimming
events to its members. The County has sent a representative swimming team to Stafford for

the 3-Counties Gala and the ASA Inter County Championships at Sheffield. Marion Britton has been active in delivering Team Manager Training and Neil Harper in the training of officials. I apologise if I have missed activity from the other disciplines but I am not aware of any County led activity in these areas. This year has seen a change in the organisation and management of the County Swimming Championships. This was in response to calls for change from County Members. There have been changes to the conditions, event structure and entry mechanisms. I hope members found the new arrangements easier to operate and that it led to a more efficient championship. Huge credit and thanks must go to Richard Tomlinson for his dedication and effort in the restructure and management of the championships. Administratively this year the County has had the welcome support of Jenny Sheppard in the County administrator role. She provides a point of contact for people from within and outside the County. This year we have seen a revamp of the County website with more information becoming available including a Twitter thingy! There have been two county newsletters generated this year in Nov13 and April14. Effective communication within the County is a significant problem and I hope the updated web, newsletter and the County administrator have gone some way to improve that. This year has seen major organisation changes in the ASA and fundamental changes in responsibility. The South West Region is now much more independent from the ASA and has effectively moved much more in line with what was the old "Western District". The County Association is a key part of the governance chain of the sport and county clubs need to be more involved and aware to influence the operation of the South West Region

Swimming – Richard Tomlinson

Re-cap of Changes Delivered in 2014

We made changes to the format of the competition and the meet conditions because:

- (a) It was specifically requested by the group tasked with reviewing the 2013 Championships or
- (b) It was needed to make the competition run more smoothly (either from the perspective of swimmers or officials or the meet manager)

The Key changes are listed below

(a) Requested Changes

- Inclusion of Multi-Disability Swimmers
- Electronic entries only (except Disability Swimmers)
- Moved from Sports Entry System to Hy-Tek Meet Manager
- Race cards abolished, replaced with signing in forms for swimmer
- Age ranges extended for 100m races to age 10/11 in line with ASA rules
- Events for 800m (Males) and 1500m (Females) removed to be consistent with SWR and National Competitions
- Distance events swum as 1500m : Males 10+ and 800m : Females 10+
- Distance events (800m and 1500m) held at 50m pool (2014 in Bath and Hengrove from 2015) as swimmers need long course times for NQTs
- Team Events with less than 9 teams swum as a straight final
- Only 2 teams allowed from each club in each team event (1 for Championship Events)
- Only 1 team from a club can swim in the final unless there would be less than 8 teams in the final
- Clubs allowed to change the order of swimmers within a team between heats and finals

- Four cut-off dates for entries
 - (i) Distance Events (20th Dec), (ii) Feb Events (10th Jan)
 - (iii) March Events (7th Feb) (iv) Team Events (21st Feb)

(b) Changes to improve the running of the competition

- Paper entries now retained by Clubs not sent to Meet Manager
- Qualifying Times from 2013 extrapolated to cover additional ages
- All 400m+ events now Heat Declared Winner races
- Other Events swum in four groups (ages are mixed together to reduce number of heats)
 - (i) Males 10/11 (ii) Females 10/11 (iii) Males 12+ (iv) Females 12+

NB We did not simplify to two groups as having the 10/11 age groups creates rest time before Championship Finals

- Order of events in sessions changed so longer distance events are swum first
- Most Medals collected from Medals table
- Medal presentations only for
 - (a) Championship medals and trophies
 - (b) Distance and Stroke Awards
 - (c) BAGCAT awards
 - (d) 10 & 11 year olds

Review on 2014 Championships

1. Meet Helpers

Thanks to the three Lead Clubs Gloucester City, Soundwell and Severnside for providing most of the helpers for each of the sessions and coordinating the volunteers.

All the helpers did a great job and the overall running of the sessions improved progressively over the course of the Championships, with the final Sunday for the relays probably the best session.

2. Signing- In.

The signing in process worked really well for the later sessions.
Thanks to the Swimmers and Coaches for making this work.

3. Programmes

Electronic copies of the programmes were issued to Clubs and put on the website.
We didn't run out of programmes and our printing costs were reduced.
Door receipts were not significantly impacted,
NB All the results etc could be accessed via Meet Mobile in real-time.

4. Electronic Timing System at GL1

For the most part this worked much more effectively for the later sessions, thanks to a lot of hard work from Marcus Lee and Alan Keeble (of Gloucester City).
We will be discussing the ongoing maintenance of GL1 equipment in the next few weeks.

Changes for the 2015 and 2016 Championships

The ASA is moving the County Championships period to January and February. Counties can do this in 2015 if they wish and are able, but the change should be in place in 2016.

Recommendation:

Run 2015 Champs with similar dates to 2014.

For 2016 all sessions will be held in January and February.

We were unable to arrange a suitable date in April or May to get direct feedback from Club Coaches. We will try to sort out a meeting in June. I then will discuss recommended changes with the County Championship Support Group.

Confirmation needed from Exec that the County Championship Support Group as appointed for 2014 can continue to operate in this role for 2015.

Revised Meet conditions will be submitted to the Exec in September 2014 for approval.

For reference my current thinking is as follows:

- (i) Reduce number of medals i.e. Finalist medals only for Championship Finals and 10/11 year olds.
- (ii) Stroke Awards to be discontinued as older swimmers already rewarded via Championship Finals.
- (iii) BAGCAT Awards given to top 3 in each Age group only.
- (iv) Revised schedule of events to get more even lengthened sessions and better balanced sessions.
- (v) In addition to the distance events, all Fly events and both 400m events will be swum as a single age group 10+ to reduce the number of heats in events where we get few 10/11 swimmers.
- (vi) Revert to two entry deadlines for main competition.
- (vii) Allow refunds for withdrawals on the grounds of ill-health.
- (viii) Remove the restriction on Clubs having only one team in a relay final.

Officials – Neil Harper

2014 saw one of the best supported County blocks from an officials perspective for many a year. When you looked down from the balcony there was a sea of white on poolside. Whilst a number of those present were undergoing training, it must augur well for the future that there are a good number coming through the system!

However, let's not get carried away, we still have a problem with lack of referees – we have one candidate sitting the exam this year, but we need more!

After the World Championships in 2013, FINA made changes to its rules. These were cascaded to the Home Countries, coming into Force in England on 01 October 2013. To ensure that officials have been kept abreast of the alterations, two CPD FINA Rule up – date sessions have been held at this venue, with approximately eighty of our officials attending.

Courses for Judges 1; 2; and 2S have been held during the last year, with a good number of the candidates having successfully gained their relevant qualifications. Should clubs be interested in running a Judges 1 course, please contact me for further information

Synchro – Ian Stuart

At the beginning of 2014 £4.3 million of funding for synchro was withdrawn at national level by UK Sport because of UK Sport's opinion that synchro will not be good enough to win medals at the next Olympics based on its 2012 performance. This will affect Team GB and the High Performance squads - how or if it will affect regional squads is not yet known, but a way for any upward progression route for swimmers to national selection has yet to be decided. The decision is being appealed by the ASA.

The Walsall Trophy, a SWR competition with six clubs taking part, will take place at Cheltenham on 17th May 2014 with Cheltenham entering an U12 duet and team and an U25 duet and team. Other future competitions are the Novice Figures competition, which gives many swimmers their first competition experience, on 28th June 2014 at Cheltenham and the Multi Regional recreational strand competition on 27th September 2014 at Plymouth.

The ASASWR Synchro Standing Committee met on 7th September 2013 and 1st March 2014 at the ASASWR office at Wellington. New FINA figures for skill assessments were introduced on 1 January 2014 for the period 2014 - 2017.

New licensing arrangements were introduced for inter-club competitions on 1st January 2014 together with licensing of officials.

Numerous skill assessment days have been arranged around the country which Gloucestershire swimmers attended, and development days have been held locally and regionally for swimmers, coaches and officials. More assessment and development days will be held during the year, using Honiton Leisure Centre and the Burnham-on-Sea pool as venues.

I would like to thank Alyson Bashford, Mary Hooper and Viv Ebbs for organising and publicising these days and their involvement in the organisation of competitions, and to thank all the coaches, officials and volunteers for their time and dedication.

Masters - Herbie Adams

Masters' Swimming in the County remains much as usual and, thus it is of value to identify what change there is:

- Age-balance appears to be shifting towards younger age groupings
- Though not yet significant in "seniors" (18-24) band
- Our championships entry was higher in our own County's swimmers but lower in our partners from Somerset and South Wales.
- And was affected by our meet's closeness to the LEN meet in Holland
- Our championships benefitted greatly from an increased number of volunteer officials
- But was slightly affected by partial malfunction of the timing systems at the venue. It is worth advising here that, if we, as a sport, do not use facilities, they will not be maintained.
- Our performance in the Inter-County Masters' event was marginally below that of the previous year for though the quality was better, in depth was less

Masters' swimming remains popular, despite competing attractions and is, thus, appreciative of the support it receives from the County, the clubs and from administrators and officials. Nevertheless its growth is slow.

This year a disability swimmer took part in Masters' and did very well.

Open Water Report – Alan Giles

Introduction & general comments

- Open Water refers to outdoor swimming (ie not in an indoor pool). Water temperature is an important consideration in Open Water training or competition (with guidance on required water temperature provided in the ASA handbook)
- As will be appreciated outdoor water temperature will be very dependent on the time of the year and sunshine (to heat the water). Consequently in the UK Open Water swimming will be limited to summer ie late May to say mid-September.

- It should be appreciated many Open Water swimmers still train regularly in the indoor pool, but also have outdoor swim sessions to acclimatise for Open Water.

In 2013

- Open Water training and familiarisations sessions were held at Henleaze Lake to allow swimmers preparation for the Open Water County Championships on Sunday 14 July 2013.

The events were 11/12 years 600m, 13 – 16 years (age group split 13/14, 15/16) 1,500m and 17 years+ 2,000m and a new event over 1,200m. Unfortunately swimmers numbers were much reduced in comparison to previous years.

- I attended the ASA South West Open Water committee on behalf of GCASA – it meets March & September, with representatives from the region's Counties.

The recent GCASA NEWSLETTER highlighted what OPEN WATER OPPORTUNITIES are being made available by the County in 2014, primarily:

- The **County Open Water Championships** are being included within the ASA SouthWest championships at Preston Beach, Weymouth on Saturday 28 and Sunday 29 June 2014.
- **Open water familiarisation sessions can be arranged at Henleaze Lake** on some weekday evenings (from approx. 7.15pm to 8.30pm) and some Saturday mornings (from approx. 9.30am to 11am)

THE THIRD ACHIEVEMENT

Is the appointment of Bristol Central SC as an ASA Beacon Club for Water Polo. This is a new ASA scheme to develop sport in various areas of the Country, it is new in Water polo, therefore it has yet to prove itself. BRISTOL CENTRAL SC WATER POLO INITIAL REPORT March 2014

Introduction

This is the first report from the operation of the BCSC Water Polo Beacon programme. It is planned that the reports will be issued twice yearly to the clubs in the regions in order to provide an update on the activity at Bristol and to give a heads up on the regional activities that are ongoing.

Bristol have received Beacon status for both Water Polo and Synchro (although as entirely separate programmes) which has started in early 2014. There are 4 water polo programmes in the UK, with the others being in Manchester, Sheffield and Crystal Palace.

Bristol's Beacon Head Coach is Craig Figes, 2012 Team GB Olympian and Captain, and he is supported by a number of current and ex-international coaches and players in delivering the Beacon sessions.

Beacon Programme - Athletes

Bristol have established a club programme which is flourishing, but is still in its relatively early days, the regional Beacon programme will provide high quality training for the best athletes in all age groups from across the region. The long term aim is for this to be established as a weekly programme centralised in Bristol, although in the shorter term, we may get this underway as a series of training days, providing both water and land based training on a monthly basis. We will publish information about these sessions as soon as we have firm details.

The Beacon sessions will be aimed to sit between the RTC's and the England Talent squads, with the intention of improving the pathway between regional clubs and International representation.

This will also pull in coaches from across the region to assist with the sessions and also to supplement the coach's forum and outreach programmes (see below for details) as part of the regional coach development programme, which is one of the key Beacon programme aims.

Coaches Forum

The first Coaches Forum was held on 28th March 2014, covering the Fundamentals of Passing and Shooting with specific exercises walked through with the coaches in the classroom and then getting them coaching in the pool, the proposed next date for the coaches forum is Friday 27th June 2014, although this may be subject to change given the clashes with RTC's on a Friday evening.

There will be a forum held every quarter with different topics discussed at each. All coaches within the region are welcome (there is no charge) and the more the merrier, please just do let us know beforehand if you intend to come.

In addition to the Coaches Forums, the outreach programme will involve Craig Figes, along with supporting assistant coaches, visiting your water polo training sessions and coaching your athletes, whilst also mentoring your coaches.

We will discuss your athletes, coaches and clubs specific needs prior to the session and will then fine tune the session to be delivered to address specific coaching requirements and techniques to be worked on following the Outreach session.

It is anticipated that the Outreach sessions will be repeated at least annually and hopefully more regularly although this is dependent on uptake from the regions clubs.

We are running the outreach sessions on a monthly basis, with the exception of July and August, and typically during the second week of each month. Therefore, if you would like to participate in the programme, please respond to me in the first instance detailing the dates / times of your sessions. Once we are able to agree a date for the initial session, we will contact you to discuss the number of athletes, coaches and any specific requirements.

This is a fantastic opportunity to have Olympic 2012 Team GB Captain Craig Figes coach and inspire the athletes at your club!

The Outreach Programme will also be free to your club.

This is very much early days for the Beacon and it is still in its development phase, but we are committed to developing water polo in the region, for the good of the athletes, the coaches and the clubs. We want you to be a part of this, so please do get in contact if you have any questions, suggestions or ideas of how we can achieve this together? All my contact details are below.
