6. Activity and Reports <p>a. Swimming – Blocks 2015</p> <p>Richard Tomlinson had provided a report prior to the meeting (see Appendix 1). It was noted that subsequent to the County Review Meeting the ASA had confirmed that County entries can only be accepted from L1-L4 licensed meets. This has now been included in the Gloucester County Championship meet conditions. Club championship will need to be licensed as a L4 meet (with the required conditions met) for times to be eligible for Gloucester County Championships. It was requested that this was highlighted to clubs when the meet documentation was published. The Gloucester County ASA Championship conditions as supplied to the meeting were approved.</p> <p>b. The approach taken to facilitate the discussion was to first go through the items raised by RT, then walk through draft programme and conditions for 2016 as a means to highlight the key issues. Any remaining issues were then discussed under AOB.

RT stated that following the meeting the draft programme and conditions would be updated. All documents would then be discussed and further updated by the Championship Review Group before being submitted to the September Executive Meeting for sign-off.

1. Entries

Issues:

Swimmers are not turning up for sessions (Do they value the competition?)

Costs are increasing (pool hire/catering/medals) etc.

It takes a lot of time to process entries when we have several close dates and 2016 competition will be condense into a shorter timescale.

RT's recommendations were

Entries Fees => increase from £4.00 to £5.50 & state in Conditions, one close date for Individual 18th December 2015, one close date for relays 30th January 2016.

The attendees felt that the increase in fees was too large but accepted that a rise was necessary. The consensus was fees should rise to £5.00.

It was requested that the close date for individual entries be moved to Monday 21st December to allow for swimmers to achieve times in Open Meets running in the weekend before Christmas. The attendees were happy with the other recommendations.

AO flag that GCASA need to consider investing in the kit at GL1 (Timing Equipment, Scoreboard etc.) as the Leisure Trust were struggling to cover the capital outlay to renew the ageing equipment. RT confirmed this was outside of his remit but would flag the issue to the Exec in September. It was also noted that we could potentially move the whole Championship to Hengrove if GL1's equipment fell below the standard required but that this would create other issues e.g. additional travel for Clubs in the north of the county.

2. Qualifying Times and Consideration Times

Issues:

Too many entries

Sessions running over 3 hours => Ideal 3 hours am and 2.5 hours pm (NB Officials must have a break after 3 hours)

Warm-ups too full.

RT's recommendation was

As ASA guidelines state we have to move to QTs only, QTs to be set between current QTs and CTs (but closer to QTs)

The attendees were comfortable with this approach and asked that RT update the QTs with aim of reducing the expected session times to 3 hours in the am and 2.5 hours in the pm.

It was noted that the Fly QTs seem to be out of line with Regional times so these need to be nearer the old CTs.

3. Session Management

Issues:

UBSC had few swimmers in S1 so struggled to find helpers

Helpers were not briefed enough prior to the sessions e.g. when they need to arrive and how long they are need for.

RT's recommendations were

Lead Clubs for 2016

S1-2 = Soundwell + (Sevenside/Gloucester)

S3-6 : Sevenside

S7-10: Gloucester

S11-16: Soundwell

FAQs and Description of all roles to be on the website.

Timings for helpers made clear

The attendees were comfortable with this approach.

The issue of flexibility around the start of the afternoon session was discussed.

RT stated that he was reluctant to vary this on the day (e.g. if we were running ahead of schedule) as some swimmers/parents could potentially miss warm-ups/races as they would expect us to follow the published start times.

4. Age Groupings

Issues:

Gap between Heats and Championship Finals for Girls is too short.

Too few 10s competing => all get a medal.

ASA guidelines state Age grouping for 2016 competition (and medals) should be:
10/11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and Over

RT's recommendation is to be swim as

Boys: A: 10/11-12 B: 13 and Over or (where possible C : 10/11 and Over)

Girls: A: 10/11-12 B: 13 and Over or (where possible C : 10/11 and Over)

The attendees were comfortable with this approach.

5. Event Order

Issues:

Some sessions too short , others too long (e.g. Session 4 and 5)

Sessions running over 3 hours => Ideal 3 hours am and 2.5 hours pm

Warm-ups too full.

RT's recommendations were

- Swim Girls' events first
- Repeat Saturday's races on Sunday but change Girls to Boys and vice versa

The attendees reviewed the Draft Programme which RT had produced on this basis and confirmed they were happy with the approach.

6. Presentations and Medals

Issues:

10/11 Years olds have long wait to get their medals

Not all swimmers turning up for presentation (~10% of medals are not presented)

Championship finalists disappear and slow process down.

Not all medals are collected.

Not enough swimmers in each age category => swimmers getting medals for turning up.

RT's recommendations were

Only present Championship events – all other medals are collected.

Presentations are immediately after championship final.

Medals for top 3 only –except Championship events = 1st – 8th.

The attendees were happy with the recommendations but requested that medals be given out to 1st – 8th for the 10/11 age category.

AM raised the problem that occasionally swimmers were unaware that they had made a Championship final. RT stated that he would endeavour to adopt the same approach as was used for some of the very busy sessions i.e. each finalist is confirmed to the relevant Club coach and verbal confirmation is requested that their swimmer will compete in the final.

7. Relays

Issues:

Change to age as at date means fewer opportunities for 16+ swimmers to compete – as only 1 open team allowed and two 17+ mixed teams.

Too many changes to teams on the day – mainly 9/10 teams.

Too many DQs for 9/10 teams – suggest swimmers not ready for this level of competition.

Timing for sessions was very tight – especially afternoon session.

RT's recommendations were

Allow 2 teams per club in each category.

Age groups: Under 12s, 13-14, 15-16, Mixed 17+, Open

The attendees did not wish to lose the 9/10 age category as this was felt to be good way to introduce swimmers/parents to the County Champs.

The attendees were broadly happy with the move to 2 club teams in each category but some representatives of smaller Clubs flagged that this may mean that their Clubs would no longer compete in the relays.

MP proposed we removed the Mixed 17+ category as compromise solution to reduce the length of the session.

RT stated that he would prefer to retain this event and would try to tighten the running of the relay sessions to accommodate all the age groups (with two teams allowed per Club) i.e.

Age groups: 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16, Mixed 17+, Open

8. AOB

(a) Poolside Access

- PJ raised the issue that some parents who were not acting as Coaches or Chaperones and who did not have a relevant Poolside Pass, were sitting with the swimmers.
- RT confirmed that he would look to police the use of Poolside Passes better and would make this clear to all Clubs.

(b) Swimmers crossing between wet-side areas and dry-side spectator areas

- SJ commented that Southwold had solved this perennial problem at their Open Meet by having 3 marshals posted by each of the relevant barriers.
- RT confirmed he would seek to do the same if we could get enough volunteers at each session.

(c) Seating Plans

- MaA asked if we could look at having allocated seating as they do for many of the Open Meets at GL1. SJ and AO said they would send RT the seating plans used at their Clubs meets. RT said he would review them to see if a similar approach could work at the County Champs.

(d) Times swum in Championship Finals do not count for Age Group records

- The attendees discussed this issue and the pros/cons of changing the conditions to enable times swum in Championship finals to count against Age Group records. In fairness to swimmers who had previously been impacted by this rule, on balance the attendees agreed that we should continue with this approach.

GLOUCESTER COUNTY ASA **OPEN WATER REPORT for meeting 7 September 2015**

Introduction

I had originally anticipated the meeting was on 14 September – as I am about to go on holiday consequently my apologies, as I will not be present on 7 September

In previous reports for Gcasa I have encouraged Clubs to take an interest in Open Water) and utilise the resources of Henleaze Lake, made available by Henleaze SC (*and enjoy the difference to swimming in the indoor pool*)

In the last month three Gcasa Clubs have done so – Bristol Penguins SC, Bristol Henleaze SC and City of Bristol SC.

What may be feasible at Henleaze Lake

It may help to mention what is feasible at Henleaze Lake by referring to the recent visit of Bristol Henleaze SC as an example. BHSC came on Tuesday 25 August from 9am to late morning – approximately 60 swimmers

It was a gloomy day - but this did not dent the enthusiasm of the BHSC coaches and swimmers (many using wet suits)

>They started off with circuits with a swim of 80 metres to the lakeside steps, and then run back to the pontoon for the next circuit to start again

>>Then they moved on to swimming relays from the pontoon to the 60 metre buoy

>>>And then diving and jumping from the spring boards – endless pleasure

If your Club is interested in Open Water opportunities in 2016 at Henleaze Lake please contact Alison Laity, Operations Manager, via the Henleaze Swimming Club website.

I liaise with Alison on a regular basis - HSC can usually accommodate just about any request for use of Henleaze Lake on Saturday mornings, possibly some evenings from late May to August and potentially any morning in the July and August school holidays – Please bear in mind the water will be cooler than the indoor pool – but if necessary wetsuits should enable swimmers to enjoy an Open Water experience

So what about competitive Open Water Swimming

As Clubs will be aware ASA SouthWest organises annual Open Water championships in the sea at Weymouth at the end of June.

I will be attending the ASA SouthWest Open Water committee meeting on Wednesday 23 September on behalf of GCASA. This committee is always interested in how Clubs / swimmers can be encouraged to promote an interest in Open Water

Gloucester County ASA – Masters Swimming Report 2014/2015

The most significant event in the Gloucestershire Masters sphere was the retirement of Herbie Adams from the post of Hon Masters Manager after many years of sterling service. I believe all Masters Swimmers in the county owe Herbie a big vote of thanks for all he has done for us.

He has been succeeded by Brian Armstrong from Gloucester Masters.

Pool Events

Gloucestershire & Somerset Masters – Horfield, September 2014

There were 57 swimmers who took part in the County meet – this was a further reduction in entrants from 69 in 2013 and 77 in 2012. The event will be staged in broadly the same format in September 2015 and hopefully get some feedback from the competitors and officials as to options for future years.

National Championships (SC) – Sheffield, October 2014

10 Gloucestershire clubs were represented at the largest annual swim meet for Masters (Backwell; Bristol Central; Bristol Masters; Bristol North; Cirencester; Dursley Dolphins; Gloucester Masters; Southwold SC; Stroud Masters; & United Bristol).

Special mention goes to the United Bristol who won all four men's relays in the 120-159 age group (4 x 50 medley & freestyle and **new British Records** in both the 4 x 100 medley & freestyle) plus Jessica Wooddisse who won four individual titles and Colin Stephenson & Tony Cherrington from Gloucester Masters who both won three individual titles. Gloucester Masters also recorded a **new British Record** for the mixed 4 x 200m freestyle.

Intercounties – Hutton Moor, November 2014.

This year Gloucestershire fielded the largest team of all the counties and this undoubtedly played a part in the team achieving a creditable 8th place (out of 29 counties) – a significant improvement over the 13th place achieved in 2013. The event returns to Hutton Moor for 2015.

British Championships (LC) – Manchester, June 2015

The stand out performance from a Gloucestershire swimmer came from Helen Kula-Przewanski from Gloucester Masters. In her 7 swims she won three golds and four silvers and broke two **British Records** in the process (100 & 200m back; W55-59). Other notable wins came from Colin Stephenson (GMSC; Gold – 50 & 100m free; M55-59), Jayne Ball (GMSC; Gold – 200m free; W60-64) and Gloucester Masters took 4 relay golds including women's 4x100 medley (200-239); mixed 4 x200m free (200-239); men's 4 x 50m free (200-239); and the mixed 4 x 200m free (240-279) in a **new British Record**.

Other Gloucestershire clubs that were represented were Backwell SC, Bristol North SC, United Bristol SC.

County records

At the moment, I am unaware of these being collated. I will endeavour to re-start the process in 2016 and look to keep things up date. Fortunately, a lot of swimmers will have South West Records – which themselves have been recently re-initiated for LC events – and this will be a good place to start!

Open Water Events

South West Championships 2015

The Gloucestershire Open Water Championships (inc. Masters) was again held in conjunction with the ASA South West Championships at Weymouth. For the Masters, only 4 swimmers from Gloucestershire raced in rough conditions. Juliet Barrell (Lydney SC, 40-49) and Sandy Jones (GMSC, 50+) won their respective age groups in the 1.5k event and Peter Gleed (Southwold SC, 30-39) was 4th in the 3k event.

Midland Championships 2015

Three Masters Swimmers from Gloucestershire participated the 3k events – Jessica Wooddisse and Mark Partridge from Stroud Masters and Brian Armstrong from Gloucester Masters. Jessica (Women's 40-49 age group) and Brian (Men's 50-59 age group) won their categories, with Mark coming 3rd in the Men's 50-59 age group.

National Championships 2015

The annual National Championships were, as usual, held at the central location of Rother Valley Country Park near Sheffield. This year there was a slight change to the event with the inclusion of an additional 1500m race for men and women in the morning and the traditional 3k race in the afternoon. The morning's events saw Brian Armstrong (Gloucester Masters) take his first national title with a win in the men's 1500m race for the 50-54yr age group.

Gloucestershire based swimmers were better represented in the afternoons 3k event. Jessica Wooddisse (Stroud Masters) comfortably won her age group (women's 40-44yr) and came second overall. In the men's 50-54yrs age group, Richard Searle (Stroud Masters) collected a well-deserved Bronze medal with Brian Armstrong (Gloucester Masters) and Mark Partridge (Stroud Masters) coming 4th and 6th respectively.

Other popular OW events – non ASA rules

The late Spring Bank Holiday at the end of May sees what is usually regarded as the inaugural open water event of the new season, the Human Race Eton Dorney Swim. In 2015, Gloucestershire had a strong presence with six swimmers from Gloucester Masters, one from Stroud Masters and 2 from Cheltenham SWPC generating 4 age group category wins, three 2nd places and a third place with all swimmers also being well placed with regard to their overall race position. The hardy Dave Granger competed without a wetsuit and was 12th overall in this category (7th man and 2nd in age group).

Three Gloucestershire ladies, Jessica Wooddisse, Kate Nimmo and Sandy Jones, took on the challenge of the **Samsung Bosphorus Cross-Continental Swimming Race** in July 2015. A record 1870 swimmers from 49 countries participated in the 6.5 km Race from Kanlıca on the Asian side to Kuruçeşme Cemil Topuzlu Park on the European side of Istanbul. Jessica finished 3rd overall in the women's competition and won her age group convincingly; Kate and Sandy also had podium appearances with Kate winning her age group and Sandy finishing 2nd in hers.

So, in summary, a strong year for Masters Clubs in Gloucestershire with a number of new British Records in the pool for our relay teams and a couple of LC individual British records for Helen Kula-Przewanski. The open water performances were also strong with our swimmers collecting tiles in both regional and national ASA Championships. The next 12 months promises to be exciting for Masters Swimmers with the results coming in from the recently held World Masters Championships in Kazan and the European Masters Championships to be held in the Olympic pool in London in May 2016.

Apologies if I have left anybody's achievements out of the report. I will certainly do better next year by recording things "as they happen" and providing regular reports for inclusion on the website.
